Travel Information





Cyprus is a small island with a long history and a rich culture, spanning over 11,000 years. It is situated in the north-eastern corner of the Mediterranean, at the meeting point of Europe, Asia, and Africa.

The island's primary Greek heritage is enriched by the many and diverse cultures that followed, including Phoenicians, Egyptians, and Romans, along with Crusaders, Byzantines, Franks, and Ottomans, who have all left an indelible legacy for the modern visitor to see and admire.

Cyprus is endowed with golden beaches, virgin green forests, and other natural wonders, inviting visitors to take full advantage of one of the most developed tourism infrastructures per-capita in the world.

Moreover, the island is recognised as one of the safest countries in the world by the World Health

Organisation, with the Cypriot people renowned for the warm welcome they extend to visitors.

Cyprus is also an important financial and business centre, owing to its modern legal and tax environment, highly educated workforce, and excellent quality of life; with over 70% of the economy focused on financial and professional services, banking, investment management, shipping, tourism, and real estate.

Getting to the Republic of Cyprus



Travellers to the Republic of Cyprus may enter only through the legal points of entry: Larnaca (LCA) and Paphos (PFO) International Airports, or the ports of Larnaca, Limassol, Latsi, and Paphos, which are situated in the area under the effective control of the Government of the Republic of Cyprus.

The closest airport to Nicosia is Larnaca International Airport (LCA) (49 km).

Entry to the territory of the Republic of Cyprus via any other port or airport in the area of Cyprus in which the Government of the Republic does not exercise effective control (Turkish-occupied area) is **illegal**.

The Capital City of Nicosia



The University of Cyprus is located in Nicosia (Lefkosia), the island's capital city. It serves as the administrative, commercial, cultural, educational, and religious centre of the country, while also geographically at the heart of the island.

Nicosia is a bustling city, where the ancient past and contemporary present blend seamlessly. The city comprises an ancient, walled city and a modern, fast-paced metropolis that is the epicentre of the island's business and commercial activity.

The city offers something of interest for everyone, with an alluring mix of events, sports, sights, shopping, arts and culture, catering to a multitude of tastes.

Moreover, Nicosia was recently ranked First by the Financial Times among Europe's cities of similar size for Human Capital and Lifestyle, ahead of Oxford, Geneva, and Basel, making it a popular destination for over 20,000 university students.

Getting to Nicosia

Airport Shuttle

Kapnos Airport Shuttle costs €9 per person from Larnaca Airport to Nicosia Station and €16 from Paphos Airport to Nicosia Station. From Nicosia Station, you would need to get a taxi ride to your hotel.

Taxis

Taxi Services are available 24 hours/7 days a week at the designated Taxi area once you exit the Arrivals Hall at Level 0. However, you are encouraged to book a taxi before your flight to Cyprus via <u>iTaxi Cyprus*</u>, <u>Airport taxis from booking.com</u> or any other travel agency. The fare from Larnaca Airport to Nicosia is ~€50 whereas the fare from Paphos Airport to Nicosia is ~€100.

Car Rentals

<u>Car rental companies</u> are operating at Larnaca and Paphos airports, whose offices are located in the Arrivals, after exiting the Baggage Reclaim area.

Bus Service
